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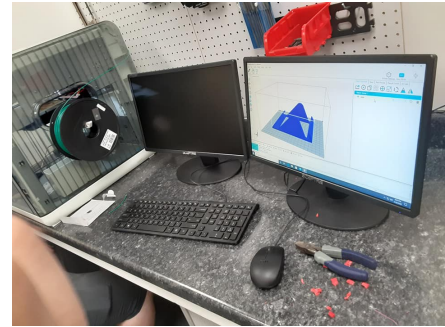

Rookery Radio and OHC:

Back in early July, Director of IT Anthony Hake sought out a more general use case for the recently upgraded multimedia lab. It was then that he contacted the faculty advisor for YSU student organization Rookery Radio - and got the ball rolling on potential collaborative opportunities.

Rookery Radio is a student run Online radio station that gives YSU students the opportunity to use real professional studio equipment to discuss topics of any caliber - given they're deemed appropriate by YSU's department of communications. Recently due to COVID-19 the Rookery Radio station on campus has been empty and collecting dust, because of the difficulty in allowing students into the building while campus is shut down.

Hake proposed that the multimedia lab could be used as an alternative site while operations on campus are pending - and even after the on campus studio becomes operational as an alternative if the DJ/Host wishes to use OHC's multimedia lab instead. Not as a replacement studio, but as an option to help students broaden their skills with a variety of equipment brands. Faculty advisor Kenny agreed this would be a beneficial opportunity and developments followed to ensure the first DJ (Mike Wildman aka DJ Red) and his crew were able to successfully broadcast "Anime with an A".

After much hard work and patience from all contributors, DJ Red was on the set and broadcasting live from RookeryRadio.com by the end of the month!

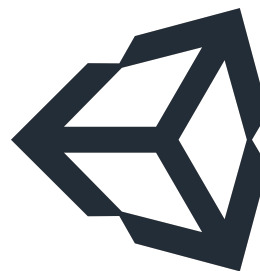

Utilizing video conference technology and asynchronous online teaching platforms, OHC Makerspace Manager Amy is proud to bring the same experience online for everyone of all ages to enjoy. So far there have been 75 students over 3 age categories learning how

to program artificial intelligence via Cozmo, 102 students of 6 age categories learned basic coding skills with Makey Makey, and 250 individuals of all ages have learned how to design 3D prints, do cricut projects, and video game design with Scratch!
