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Raspberry Pi After School Online

In the past, Oak Hill Collaborative has partnered with United Way and Success After Six to help education in the inner city schools of Youngstown on all things computer science. During this program students from 4th - 8th grade are given a kit to build their own Raspberry Pi computer, and then they are taught all the skills necessary to learn how to use it.

After the program, they then get to take their Raspberry Pis home with them to use on their own. From that point forward they have their own means of connecting to the Internet! That's a quick outline of what the Raspberry Pi After School program. Here, Raspberry Pi After School Online is the same exact educational experience, but online instead of in person at the schools. Thanks to support from Youngstown Foundation and United Way, we are exploring new avenues.

Ideally we would love for our students to receive a "care package" once a week, each week being similar to the new, engaging experience they receive in class. With options for guided videos and supervised remote instructor sessions, we're priming the inventors of tomorrow!
